Thank you for considering the Riverside-Corona Resource Conservation District's 1, 2, 3...for the Butterflies and Bees pollinator habitat kit program. Any resident or community entity such as a library, school, community garden, farm, business, community center, etc., located within the RCRCRD district boundary, is welcome to apply for a **free** kit. Approximately 50-60 kits will be available each year and priority will be given to those individuals or entities located in an underserved community. Two to four different kits will be available to choose from year to year and plant species will vary depending on plant availability. Each kit will cover approximately 150-1000 square feet, depending on kit type and planting layout. Those that apply but do not receive a kit due to availability, will be placed on a waiting list and receive priority for the following year. One kit per applicant. Applicants who receive a kit are not eligible to reapply.
